Pursuant to NCGS § 131E-185, BAYADA Home Health Care submits the following comments in opposition to the Interim HealthCare (Interim) CON application.

REVIEW CRITERIA FOR NEW INSTITUTIONAL HEALTH SERVICES

- (3) The applicant shall identify the population to be served by the proposed project, and shall demonstrate the need that this population has for the services proposed, and the extent to which all residents of the area, and, in particular, low income persons, racial and ethnic minorities, women, handicapped persons, the elderly, and other underserved groups are likely to have access to the services proposed.

Interim fails to provide any methodology or assumptions that reasonably results in a projection of 673 New Hanover County patients in Year 3.

Interim fails to provide a Section Q in either the application or exhibits.

- (5) Financial and operational projections for the project shall demonstrate the availability of funds for capital and operating needs as well as the immediate and long-term financial feasibility of the proposal, based upon reasonable projections of the costs of and charges for providing health services by the person proposing the service.

Pursuant to NCGS § 131E-185, BAYADA Home Health Care submits the following comments in opposition to the Aveanna Health Home – New Hanover (Aveanna) CON application.

REVIEW CRITERIA FOR NEW INSTITUTIONAL HEALTH SERVICES

- (3) The applicant shall identify the population to be served by the proposed project, and shall demonstrate the need that this population has for the services proposed, and the extent to which all residents of the area, and, in particular, low income persons, racial and ethnic minorities, women, handicapped persons, the elderly, and other underserved groups are likely to have access to the services proposed.

Aveanna only provides a methodology leading to the total unduplicated patient in Years 1 through 3. However, Aveanna fails to provide any methodology or assumptions that reasonably results in the completion of Form C.5.

- (5) Financial and operational projections for the project shall demonstrate the availability of funds for capital and operating needs as well as the immediate and long-term financial feasibility of the proposal, based upon reasonable projections of the costs of and charges for providing health services by the person proposing the service.

Interim fails to provide any assumptions that can reasonably result in the completion of Forms F.2b and F.3b in Section Q.

- (3) The applicant shall identify the population to be served by the proposed project, and shall demonstrate the need that this population has for the services proposed, and the extent to which all residents of the area, and, in particular, low income persons, racial and ethnic minorities, women, handicapped persons, the elderly, and other underserved groups are likely to have access to the services proposed.

Well Care identifies that it already provides home care and home health services in New Hanover County and is the largest home health provider in New Hanover County.

Pursuant to NCGS § 131E-185, BAYADA Home Health Care submits the following comments in opposition to the HealthView Home Health – New Hanover (HealthView) CON application.

REVIEW CRITERIA FOR NEW INSTITUTIONAL HEALTH SERVICES

- (3) The applicant shall identify the population to be served by the proposed project, and shall demonstrate the need that this population has for the services proposed, and the extent to which all residents of the area, and, in particular, low income persons, racial and ethnic minorities, women, handicapped persons, the elderly, and other underserved groups are likely to have access to the services proposed.

HealthView fails to demonstrate the need that the proposed population has for an additional home health office. HealthView includes multiple exhibits, however, HealthView fails to discuss why the exhibits demonstrate a need for an additional home health agency in New Hanover County.

HealthView fails to provide any methodology or assumptions that reasonably results in the completion of Form C.5.

- (5) Financial and operational projections for the project shall demonstrate the availability of funds for capital and operating needs as well as the immediate and long-term financial feasibility of the proposal, based upon reasonable projections of the costs of and charges for providing health services by the person proposing the service.

Pro Forma Financial Statements

HealthView does not provide enough data or explanation within the application or exhibits for the Agency to determine if the pro forma financial statements and utilization are reasonable, credible, or supported.

HealthView fails to provide any of the supporting data or calculations withing the application or exhibits.

The Agency has no means to determine if the pro forma financial statements are reasonable, credible, supported, or accurate.

COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS

Pursuant to G.S. 131E-183(a)(1) and the 2023 SMFP, no more than one new Medicare-certified home health agency may be approved for New Hanover County in this review. Because each application proposes to develop a new Medicare-certified home health agency in New Hanover County, all five applications cannot be approved. For the reasons set forth below and in the remainder of the findings, the application submitted by BAYADA Home Health should be approved and all other applications should be disapproved.

Projected Access by Service Area Residents

For each application in this review, the following table compares a) the number of New Hanover County patients in Project Year 3; and b) total patients as a percentage of total unduplicated patients. Generally, the application projecting the highest number or percentage is the most effective alternative with regard to these comparative factors. Well Care Home Health already provides home health services in New Hanover County and is the largest home health provider in New Hanover County; HealthView Home Health, Aveanna Home Health, and Interim failed to provide any utilization methodology or assumptions to determine if their projections are reasonable, credible, or supported.

Average Number of Visits per Unduplicated Patient

The majority of home health care services are covered by Medicare, which does not reimburse on a per visit basis. Rather, Medicare reimburses on a per episode basis. Thus, there is a financial disincentive to providing more visits per Medicare episode. The following table shows the average number of visits per unduplicated patient projected by each applicant in Project Year 3. Generally, the application proposing the highest number of visits per unduplicated patient is the more effective alternative with regard to this comparative factor. The applications are listed in the table below in decreasing order of effectiveness.

Average Net Patient Revenue per Visit

Average net revenue per visit in Project Year 3 was calculated by dividing projected net revenue from Form B by the projected number of visits from Form C.5, as shown in the table below. Generally, the application proposing the lowest average net revenue per visit is the more effective alternative with regard to this comparative factor. The applications are listed in the table below in decreasing order of effectiveness.

Well Care Home Health already provides home health services in New Hanover County and is the largest home health provider in New Hanover County; HealthView Home Health, Aveanna Home Health, and Interim failed to provide any utilization methodology or assumptions to determine if their projections are reasonable, credible, or supported.

Average Net Revenue per Unduplicated Patient

Average net revenue per unduplicated patient in Project Year 3 was calculated by dividing projected net revenue from Form F.2b by the projected number of unduplicated patients from Form C.5, as shown in the table below. Generally, the application proposing the lowest average net revenue per unduplicated patient is the more effective alternative with regard to this comparative factor. Average Total Operating Cost per Visit

The average total operating cost per visit in Project Year 3 was calculated by dividing projected operating costs from Form F.3b by the total number of visits from Form C.5, as shown in the table below. Generally, the application proposing the lowest average total operating cost per visit is the more effective alternative with regard to this comparative factor. Ratio of Average Net Revenue per Visit to Average Total Operating Cost per Visit

The ratios in the table below were calculated by dividing the average net revenue per visit in Project Year 3 by the average total operating cost per visit in Project Year 3. Generally, the application proposing the lowest ratio is the more effective alternative with regard to this comparative factor. However, the ratio must equal one or greater in order for the proposal to be financially feasible. The applications are listed in the table below in decreasing order of effectiveness.
