Two compete for fixed MRI scanner in Mecklenburg County

RALEIGH – Two applicants have filed competing Certificate of Need proposals with the N.C. Department of Health and Human Services in response to a need determination in the 2016 State Medical Facilities Plan for a fixed magnetic resonance imaging scanner in Mecklenburg County.

A public hearing for these proposed projects will be held July 18 at 1 p.m. in Conference Room 280, in Charlotte-Mecklenburg Government Center, 600 East 4th St., Charlotte.

The proposals are described as follows:

- Carolinas Imaging Services proposes to acquire one fixed MRI scanner to be located at Carolinas Imaging Services – Huntersville. The project is expected to cost \$2.2 million and to be completed in January 2018.
- The Presbyterian Hospital proposes to acquire one fixed MRI scanner to be located at Novant Health Huntersville Medical Center. The project is expected to cost \$2.3 million and to be completed by January 2018.

Anyone may file written comments concerning these proposals. Comments must be received by the Healthcare Planning and Certificate of Need Section no later than 5:30 p.m. on July 1.
