Two Compete for Fixed MRI Scanner in Mecklenburg County

RALEIGH — Two applicants have filed competing certificate of need applications with the N.C. Department of Health and Human Services in response to a need determination in the 2017 State Medical Facilities Plan for a fixed magnetic resonance imaging scanner in Mecklenburg County.

The proposals are as follows:

- Novant Health proposes to acquire one fixed MRI scanner to be located at Presbyterian Medical Center. The project is expected to cost \$3.5 million and be completed in July 2020.
- Mercy Hospital proposes to acquire one fixed MRI scanner to be located at Carolinas HealthCare System Pineville. The project is expected to cost \$5.2 million and would be completed in January 2019.

A public hearing for these proposed projects will be held Dec. 19 at 2 p.m. in Community Room B, Beatties Ford Regional Library, 2412 Beatties Ford Road in Charlotte.

Anyone may file written comments concerning this proposal. Comments must be received by the Healthcare Planning and Certificate of Need Section no later than 5:30 p.m. on Dec. 1.
