17	(d) Except for designated units with higher staffing requirements noted elsewhere in this Subchapter, daily direct	
18	patient care nursing staff, licensed and unlicensed, shall equal or exceed 2.1 nursing hours per patient per day. (This	
19	is sometimes referred to as nursing hours per patient day or NHPPD or NH/PD.) include:	
20	(1)	Inclusive in these nursing hours is the requirement that at At least one licensed nurse is on duty for
21		direct patient care at all times.
22	(2)	Nursing care shall include the services of a A registered nurse for at least eight consecutive hours
23		a day, seven days a week. This coverage can be spread over more than one shift if such a need
24		exists. The director of nursing may be counted as meeting the requirements for both the director of
25		nursing and patient staffing for facilities with a total census of 60 nursing beds or less.
26	(3)	Nursing support personnel, including ward clerks, secretaries, nurse educators and persons in
27		primarily administrative management positions and not actively involved in direct patient care,
28		shall not be counted toward compliance with minimum daily requirements for direct care staffing.
29	(e) An exception to meeting the minimum staffing requirements shall be reported to the Department at the end of	
30	each month. Staffing waivers granted by the federal government for Medicare and Medicaid certified beds shall be	
31	accepted for licensure purposes.
