# Which Health Care Facilities Are Required To Report?

- Adult Care Homes
- Community-Based Providers of Services not required to be licensed by DHSR (provides services to individuals with mental illness, intellectual disability, or substance abuse)
- Family Care Homes
- Home Care Agencies

- Home Health Agencies
- Hospices
- Hospitals
- ICF/IID (Intermediate Care Facility for Individuals with Intellectual Disability)
- In-Home Aide Services funded through the Home and Community Care Block Grant Program (under the Division of Aging)

- Multiunit Assisted Housing with Services (assisted living facility with hands-on personal care & nursing services arranged by the facility with a licensed home care or hospice agency)
- Nursing Facilities/Skilled Nursing Facilities
- Nursing Pool Agencies
- Psychiatric Hospitals

- Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facilities
- Residential Facilities, 24-Hour Facilities and Licensable Facilities (includes group homes & day treatment facilities that provide services to individuals with mental illness, intellectual disability or substance abuse)
- State-Operated Facilities

#### Who Should Be Reported?

 Any accused unlicensed staff of a health care facility that has direct access to patients, clients, or their property.

 For Nursing Facilities/Skilled Nursing Facilities – any accused individuals.

#### What is Direct Access?

 Direct access includes any unlicensed staff that during the course of employment at a health care facility has the opportunity for direct contact with an individual or an individual's property, when that individual is a resident or person to whom services are provided.

#### What Allegations Should Be Reported?

- Resident Abuse
- Resident Neglect
- Diversion of Resident or Facility Drugs
- Fraud Against Resident or Facility
- Misappropriation of Resident or Facility Property
- Injuries of Unknown Source

#### **ALLEGATION DEFINITIONS**

#### **Abuse**

- The willful infliction of injury, unreasonable confinement, intimidation, or punishment with resulting physical harm, pain or mental anguish.
- Willful, as used in this definition of abuse, means the individual must have acted deliberately, not that the individual must have intended to inflict injury or harm.

# **Abuse (continued)**

- Abuse also includes the deprivation by an individual, including a caretaker, of goods or services that are necessary to attain or maintain physical, mental, and psychosocial well-being.
- Abuse includes verbal abuse, sexual abuse, physical abuse, and mental abuse including abuse facilitated or enabled through the use of technology.

#### Abuse (continued)

 Instances of abuse of all residents, irrespective of any mental or physical condition, cause physical harm, pain or mental anguish.

#### **Neglect**

The <u>failure</u> of the facility, its employees or service providers to provide goods and services to a resident that are <u>necessary to avoid</u> physical harm, pain, mental anguish or emotional distress.

# **Diversion of Resident/Facility Drugs**

The <u>unauthorized taking</u> or <u>use</u> of any drug belonging to a resident or any drug belonging to a facility.

# Fraud Against Resident/Facility

The <u>intentional</u> misrepresentation or deception made by a person with the knowledge that the deception could result in some <u>unauthorized benefit</u> to himself or some other person.

# Misappropriation - Resident/Facility Property

The <u>deliberate</u> misplacement, exploitation or wrongful temporary or permanent use of a resident's/facility's belongings or money <u>without the resident's/facility's consent</u>.

#### Injury of Unknown Source

 The source of the injury was <u>not observed</u> by any person or <u>could not be explained</u> by the resident;

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- The injury is <u>suspicious</u> because of:
  - the extent or location of the injury or
  - the number of injuries observed at one particular point in time or
  - the incidence of injuries over time.

#### When to Report the Initial Allegation

- If the incident occurred in a <u>SNF/NF</u> and involves abuse or results in serious bodily injury, then the allegation must be reported to HCPI within <u>2 hours</u> after the allegation is made.
- If the incident occurred in an <u>ICF/IID</u> or Hospice and involves a suspicion of a crime resulting in serious bodily injury, then the allegation must be reported to HCPI within <u>2 hours</u> after the allegation is made.

#### When to Report the Initial Allegation

 Otherwise, the allegation must be reported to HCPI within <u>24 hours</u> after the allegation is made.

#### **Facility Investigation Requirements**

 Facilities must have evidence that all alleged acts are thoroughly investigated by the facility

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• Facilities must make every effort to protect residents from harm while the investigation is in progress.

#### **Facility Investigation Activities**

- Observe Incident Site
- Interview:
  - Resident(s)
  - Accused Individual(s)
  - Witnesses (including other residents)
  - Facility Staff
  - Others With Knowledge

- Review:
  - Resident's Medical Record
  - Accused Individual's Personnel File
  - Policies & Procedures
  - Training Records
  - Pictures/Video/Social Media (need to maintain a copy)
  - Other Applicable Documentation

# When to Submit the Investigation Report

- If the incident occurred in a <u>SNF/NF, ICF/IID</u> or <u>Hospice</u>, according to Federal requirements, the facility's Investigation Report should be reported to HCPI within <u>5</u> working days of the incident.
- Otherwise, according to State Statutes, the facility's Investigation Report should be reported to HCPI within <u>5 working days</u> of the Initial Allegation Report.
