Dear Mr. Turner:

The Certificate of Need (CON) Section, Division of Health Service Regulation, Department of Health and Human Services has conditionally approved the above referenced certificate of need application. This decision was made after a review of the applications submitted for this cycle and after consideration of the Certificate of Need Law, G.S. 131E-175 et. seq. and regulations promulgated thereunder, the State Medical Facilities Plan, and other applicable information. Attached to this letter are the required findings made with respect to your application. The applicant shall not proceed with the construction, offering or development of this project until the certificate of need is issued. Further, the Department shall not issue the certificate of need until all applicable conditions of approval that can be satisfied before issuance of the certificate of need have been met pursuant to G.S. 131E-187(a). The conditions are as follows:

1. Holly Hill Hospital, LLC, Holly Hill Real Estate, LLC and Universal Health Services, Inc. shall materially comply with all representations made in the certificate of need application.
2. Holly Hill Hospital, LLC, Holly Hill Real Estate, LLC and Universal Health Services, Inc. shall develop and operate no more than 37 additional inpatient psychiatric beds for a total licensed bed complement of no more than 117 adult inpatient psychiatric beds, 60 child and adolescent



inpatient psychiatric beds and 28 chemical dependency treatment beds upon completion of this project and Project I.D. #J-8442-09.

3. Holly Hill Hospital, LLC, Holly Hill Real Estate, LLC and Universal Health Services, Inc. shall accept patients requiring involuntary admission for inpatient psychiatric services.
4. Holly Hill Hospital, LLC, Holly Hill Real Estate, LLC and Universal Health Services, Inc. shall acknowledge acceptance of and agree to comply with all conditions stated herein to the Certificate of Need Section in writing prior to issuance of the certificate of need.

Response to the above conditions should be submitted to the CON Section no later than 35 days from the date of the decision. Failure to respond within this time period may result in the CON Section making a determination not to issue a certificate of need for the project referenced above.

The conditional approval is valid only for a capital expenditure of \$25,000. If a cost overrun occurs that exceeds the approved capital expenditure amount, a new certificate of need may be required as determined by G.S. 131E-176(16)(e).

The applicant should be aware that according to the Certificate of Need Law any affected person shall have thirty (30) days after the date of decision to file a petition for a contested case on this approval. Further, if you are aggrieved by the conditions of the decision you may file a petition for a contested case hearing in accordance with G.S. 150B, Article 3, as amended. This petition must be filed with the Office of Administrative Hearings, 6714 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, North Carolina 27699-6714 within thirty (30) days of the date of this decision. [Note: Effective October 1, 2009, OAH requires a filing fee with submittal of petitions for contested cases. Please direct all questions regarding this fee to OAH Clerk's Office (919-431-3000).]

G.S. 150B-23 provides that a party filing a petition must also serve a copy of the petition on all parties to the petition. Therefore, if you file a petition for a contested case hearing, you must serve a copy of the petition on the Department of Health and Human Services by mailing a copy of your petition to:

It is requested that a copy of the petition also be served on the Certificate of Need Section. The certificate of need will not be issued before the completion of this 30 day period ending September 24, 2012. If a contested case request is received within the thirty (30) day period, the certificate will not be issued until the appeal is resolved (10A NCAC 14C .0208).
