Two dialysis providers compete for dialysis stations in Nash County

RALEIGH – Two competing applications have been filed with the Certificate of Need Section of the N.C. Division of Health Service Regulation to develop dialysis stations in Nash County.

A public hearing for these projects will be held at 11 a.m. on Nov. 18 in the Warner Meeting Room, 1st Floor, Braswell Memorial Library, 727 Grace St., Rocky Mount.

The July 2013 Semiannual Dialysis Report identified a need for 19 additional dialysis stations in Nash County. A brief description of each project follows:

- Bio-Medical Applications of North Carolina, Inc. proposes to add 11 stations to an existing dialysis facility at 750 English Road in Rocky Mount. There are not expected to be any capital costs associated with this project and the project is expected to be complete in December 2014.
- Total Renal Care, Inc. proposes to develop a new 12-station dialysis facility at Winstead Avenue and English Road in Rocky Mount. The project is expected to cost \$1.6 million and to be complete in July 2015.
