Applicants Compete for One Fixed MRI Scanner in Wake County

RALEIGH — Six certificate of need applications have been filed with the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services to develop a single fixed MRI scanner in Wake County.

Pinnacle Health Services of North Carolina LLC proposes to acquire one fixed MRI scanner to be located at Raleigh Radiology Wake Forest. The project is expected to cost \$2.1 million and would be completed in January 2021.

EmergeOrtho P.A. proposes to acquire one fixed MRI scanner to be located at EmergeOrtho P.A. in Raleigh. The project is expected to cost \$1.9 million and would be completed in January 2021.

Raleigh Radiology LLC proposes two projects:

- Acquire one fixed MRI scanner to be located at Raleigh Radiology in Cary. The project is expected to cost \$2.9 million and would be completed in January 2021.
- Acquire one fixed MRI scanner to be located at Raleigh Radiology Knightdale. The project is expected to cost \$2.5 million and would be completed in January 2021.

Duke University Health System Inc. proposes to acquire one fixed MRI scanner to be located at a new facility, Duke Radiology Green Level, in Cary. The project is expected to cost \$3.6 million and would be completed in July 2022.
