Dear Mr. Normark:

In response to your letters of May 16th, June 1st and July 17, 2012 and email of July 17, 2012, the above referenced proposal is exempt from certificate of need review in accordance with N.C.G.S 131E-184(a)(7). Therefore, you may proceed to temporarily acquire, without a certificate of need, the MQ-20 Temporary Replacement MRI Mobile Scanner to replace the existing Hitachi Altaire 0.7T MRI Scanner until the new Hitachi Oasis 1.2T MRI fixed scanner is installed and operational at which time the MQ-20 Temporary Replacement MRI Mobile Scanner will be removed from the State and not brought back to North Carolina without CON approval. This determination is based on your representations that the existing unit will be removed from North Carolina and will not be used again in the State without first obtaining a certificate of need. Further please be advised that as soon as the replacement equipment is acquired, you must provide the CON Section and the Medical Facilities Planning Section with the serial number of the new equipment to update the inventory, if not already provided. In addition, you should contact the Construction Section, DHSR to determine if they have any requirements for development of the proposed project.

It should be noted that this Agency's position is based solely on the facts represented by you and that any change in facts as represented would require further consideration by this Agency and a separate determination. If you have any questions concerning this matter, please feel free to contact this office.

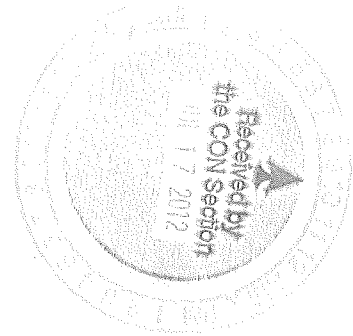

On May 16, 2012, Carolina Imaging submitted correspondence to the Certificate of Need Section regarding its intention to acquire a replacement MRI scanner (the "Permanent Replacement") at its existing outpatient imaging center in Fayetteville. A copy of that correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit "1". On June 1, 2012, Carolina Imaging submitted a separate request regarding the utilization of a temporary mobile MRI scanner while Carolina Imaging is replacing the existing Hitachi Altaire MRI scanner (the "Existing Scanner"). A copy of that correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit "2". The purpose of this letter is to request the use of a different temporary mobile unit during the time that the Existing Scanner is being replaced at Carolina Imaging. Specifically, Carolina Imaging seeks to utilize the MQ-20 mobile MRI unit instead of the MQ-12 unit that was originally requested by Carolina Imaging on May 16.

All the information provided by Carolina Imaging in its May 16, 2012 remains the same except that Carolina Imaging has attached a new Equipment Comparison Form detailing the information concerning the MQ-20 mobile MRI unit. There are no construction costs involved in the MQ-20 Temporary Replacement Scanner at Carolina Imaging. The MQ -20 Temporary Replacement Scanner, is equipped with all the items needed to perform MRI scans. The MQ-20 Temporary Replacement Scanner will be parked at Carolina Imaging, 3628 Cape Center Drive, Fayetteville, North Carolina. Carolina Imaging has a mobile pad available for use during this time. The MQ-20 Temporary Replacement Scanner will stay at Carolina Imaging throughout the Replacement Period; it will not travel to any other location.

This proposal meets the definition of "replacement equipment" as set forth in N.C. Gen. Stat. § 131E-176(22a) because:

1. The cost of the equipment and the cost of all activities essential to acquiring and making operational the replacement equipment are less than \$2 million;
2. The existing Altaire is currently in use;
3. The existing Altaire will be removed from North Carolina when MQ-20 arrives in Fayetteville and will not be brought back to North Carolina without CON approval. Likewise, MQ-20 will be removed from North Carolina when the Permanent Replacement is installed and will not be brought back to North Carolina without CON approval.
4. The sole purpose of this proposal is to temporarily replace comparable medical equipment.

Further, this proposal meets the requirements of 10A NCAC 14C .0303(d) because:



On behalf of Carolina Imaging and in accordance with N.C. Gen. Stat. § 131E-184(a)(7), I am writing to notify the Department of Carolina Imaging's intention to acquire a replacement MRI scanner for its existing outpatient imaging center in Cumberland County.

Carolina Imaging owns a Hitachi Altaire 0.7T MRI scanner ("Altaire") that is over seven (7) years old. See Exhibit A, attached replacement equipment comparison form. This MRI scanner now needs to be replaced. Carolina Imaging intends to replace the existing Altaire with a Hitachi Oasis 1.2T MRI scanner ("Oasis").

The estimated construction costs, including architect's fees and project contingency, for the proposed replacement equipment total \$363,350. The purchase price of the Oasis is \$1,345,000. Carolina Imaging will also acquire an injector for contrast studies for \$25,819. The total equipment cost including tax is \$1,466,776. The total capital expenditure for the proposed replacement equipment project is \$1,830,126.



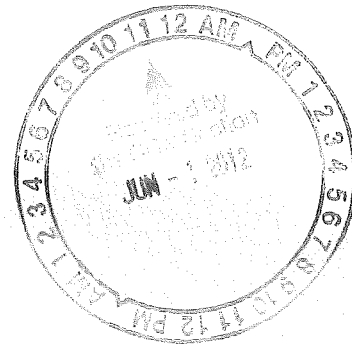

On May 16, 2012, Carolina Imaging submitted correspondence to the Certificate of Need Section regarding its intention to acquire a replacement MRI scanner (the "Permanent Replacement") at its existing outpatient imaging center in Fayetteville. A copy of that correspondence is attached hereto as Exhibit "1". The purpose of this letter is to inform the Agency that Carolina Imaging has determined that it will need to utilize a temporary mobile MRI scanner while Carolina Imaging is replacing the existing Hitachi Altaire MRI scanner (the "Existing Scanner").

In an effort to avoid inconveniencing patients and referring physicians, Carolina Imaging is seeking to employ a temporary mobile MRI scanner in order to provide sufficient MRI coverage while the Existing Scanner is shut down and construction is underway to accommodate the Permanent Replacement. Carolina Imaging estimates that the construction and installation process for the Permanent Replacement will take 12-16 weeks (the Replacement Period). Therefore, during the Replacement Period, Carolina Imaging will contract with MedQuest to have the MedQuest MQ-12 mobile MRI scanner (the "Temporary Replacement Scanner") that is currently outside the State of North Carolina brought to Fayetteville to meet Carolina Imaging's needs during the Replacement Period. As soon as the Permanent Replacement is operational, the Temporary Replacement Scanner will leave the State of North Carolina and will not be brought back into North Carolina without CON approval. At no time during the Replacement Period will Carolina Imaging be increasing the number of MRI scanners in the Cumberland County MRI inventory. At no time during the Replacement Period will Carolina Imaging be concurrently operating the Existing Scanner and the Temporary Replacement Scanner.



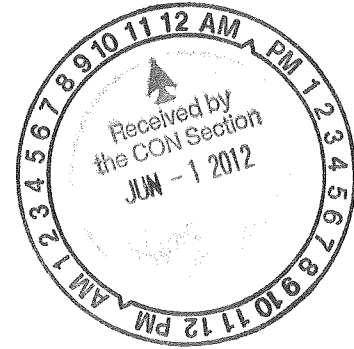


