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Importance of Home Management Tasks (1)

 - COPD (Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease)

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
○ CHF (Congestive Heart Failure)

Importance of Home Management Tasks (2)

- It is possible that some patients have never learned sanitary, safety, or even grocery shopping techniques.
- The home care aide can model healthy habits to the patient.




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HOME MANAGEMENT TASKS

- Heavy cleaning versus light cleaning
- •When the home aide is in the home, he or she is expected to provide care for the assigned patient only.
- Even if the patient has other family members living in the same home, the home care aide is there to assist the patient only, and is not there to provide these tasks for the whole family.



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DEVELOPING A ROUTINE

- The home care aide's supervisor will assign home management tasks on the patient's plan of care.
- Writing out daily or weekly plans with the patient will help in setting up a routine, and will help the home care aide to clearly see the tasks assigned and a scheduled way of completing them.




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Frequency of Home Management Tasks



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
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MAKING A DIFFERENCE
