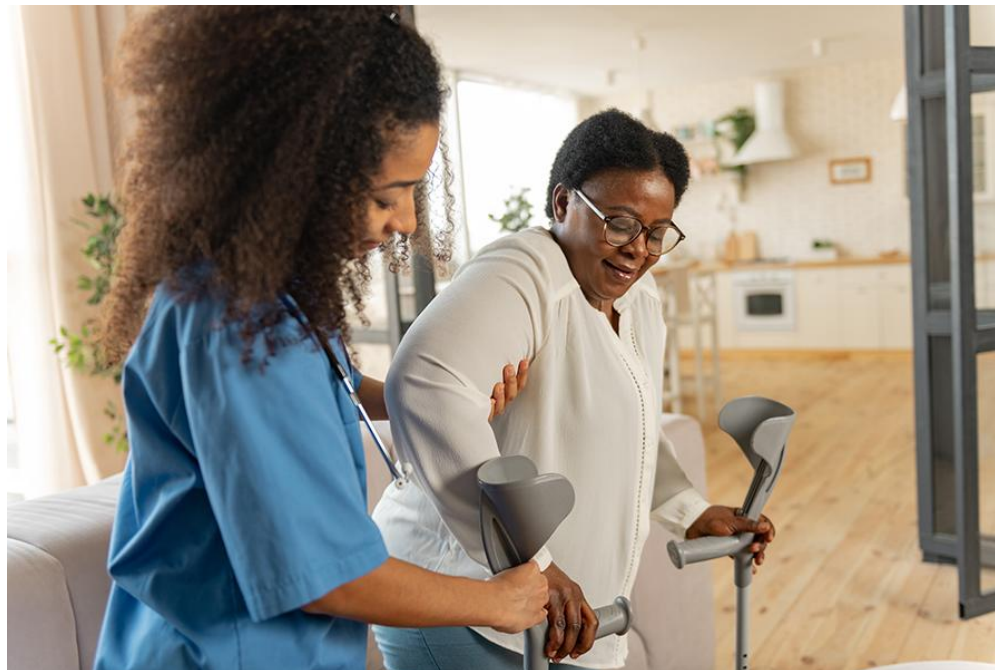

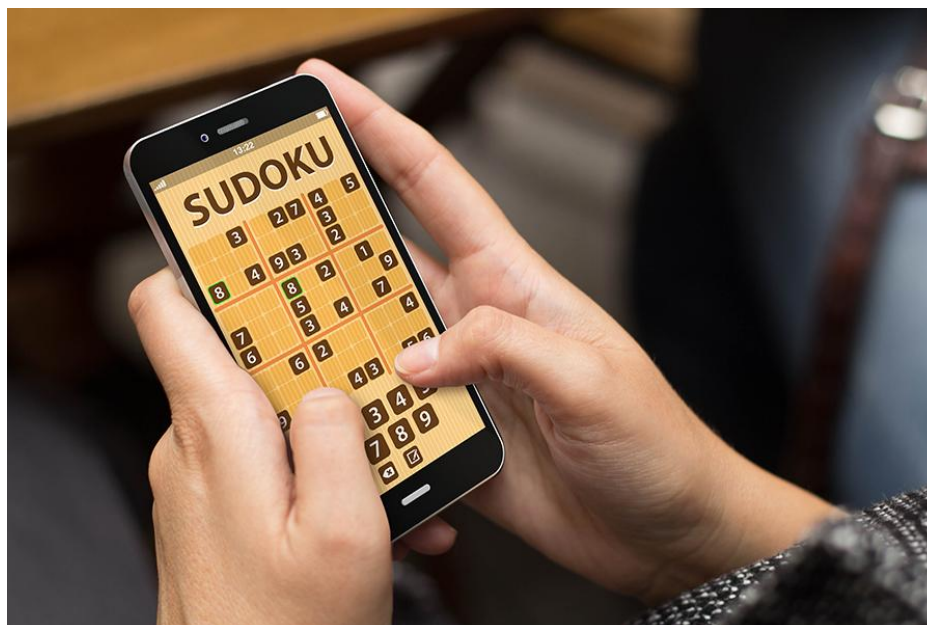

Home Modifications
