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**PETITION FOR AN ADJUSTED NEED DETERMINATION FOR ADULT CARE
HOME BEDS IN HYDE COUNTY**

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Requested Adjustment:

Liberty Commons Nursing and Rehab Center of Hyde County, LLC, d/b/a Cross Creek Health Care (“Cross Creek”) requests an Adjustment to the Need Determination for Proposed 2019 State Medical Facilities Plan (SMFP). Cross Creek asks that the Proposed 2019 State Medical Facilities Plan be modified to add a special need for 23 adult care home beds in Hyde County. The Applicants recognize that Hyde and Tyrrell are considered a combined service area for Chapter 11 of the SMFP. However, this request is to add the 23 beds exclusively to Hyde County.

Liberty Company Background:

The Liberty Healthcare Group (“Liberty”) is guided by the Liberty Management Group which consists of three management companies: Liberty Healthcare Management, Inc., Liberty Healthcare and Rehabilitation Services d/b/a Liberty Healthcare and Rehabilitation Services, and Liberty Senior Living, LLC.

Liberty provides management and support to twenty-seven skilled nursing facilities (included the applicants Cross Creek) with a total of 2,654 licensed skilled nursing beds. 1,398 of these beds are licensed in stand-alone skilled nursing facilities, and the remaining 1,256 skilled nursing beds are licensed in combination facilities with assisted living beds (adult care home beds). Successfully operating these facilities has resulted in the company’s executive management having extensive experience and knowledge in operating skilled nursing facilities. Because of this expertise, Liberty is able to provide care for patients with a wide variety of diagnoses and needs. Liberty provides cost-effective, high-quality care that meets the needs of patients in today’s quickly changing health care system.

The principals in this enterprise are **John A. “Sandy” McNeill Jr.** and **Ronald B. “Ronnie” McNeill**. Sandy, a pharmacist by training, has had many years of business experience in the health care field. He has opened and operated four pharmacies and developed Medi-Care Supply Company, a durable medical equipment provider, from a relatively small operation with one location in 1975 to a multi-million dollar corporation with 16 locations when it was sold in 1986 to a Fortune 500 company.

Ronnie is a Registered Professional Engineer with a Master’s Degree in Business Administration. He brings technical, financial and health care insurance reimbursement expertise to the organization. He previously served as Chief Financial Officer and Billing Manager of Medi-Care Supply Company. He contributes his substantial expertise in financial management and cost control to the efficient operation of the organization.

Jeff Wilson, LNHA joined Liberty in 1998 and is currently the Chief Operating Officer of the Liberty Healthcare Group. Jeff has been involved in long term care operations for over 30 years, including having served as an administrator for ten years. Jeff serves on the Board of Directors of the North Carolina Health Care Facilities Association and has been active on many association committees. **Paul Babinski**, MBA, LNHA who is the President of Liberty Healthcare and Rehabilitation Services. Paul has been a Licensed Nursing Home Administrator since 1985. He served as a nursing home administrator from 1985 to 1995, and has held regional management positions of increasing responsibility leading to his current position. In addition to his management responsibilities for nursing centers in North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia, Paul has held board and committee chair roles for the North Carolina Health Care Facilities Association, the South Carolina Health Care Association and the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Council on Aging. **Roxanne Thompson**, RN, LNHA, Regional Director of Operations of Liberty Healthcare and Rehabilitation Services, joined the company in 2017. Roxanne has been a Licensed Administrator since 2009 and a registered nurse for 20 years. She has 18 years of long term care experience in both clinical, as a previous Director of Nursing and Clinical services Consultant. She was a senior executive director assisting with high risk facilities prior to joining Liberty. **Amy Fann**, RN, LNHA, Vice President of Clinical Operations of Liberty Healthcare and Rehabilitation Services, joined Liberty in September 1995. She has worked in long term care for more than 20 years and has been both a Director of Nursing and an Administrator. Amy serves on the Nurse Council of the North Carolina Health Care Facilities Association and has been active on many association committees. Quality Assurance Nurse Consultants include **Lorna Mumo**, RN, **Linda Peterson**, RN, **Cassie Faircloth**, RN and **Valerie Siverls**, RN along with MDS Nurse Consultants **Catherine Mbuqua**, RN, and **Gina Robinson**, RN. Liberty Healthcare also employs **Ellen Anderson**, **Anne Smith** and **Sara Bowersox**, all Registered Dietitians, for Dietary services support. **Tammy McPherson** and her team support our therapeutic rehabilitation services. **Shan Miller** oversees HIM & Coding support. **Curtis Vickers** oversees Plant Operations & Environmental Services support.

Liberty Healthcare Management, Inc. provides accounting, human resources, risk management and other support services to all 27 nursing homes. **Kim McNeill**, MBA oversees Human Resources and **Kim Kilday**, MBA heads the marketing team. **Penny Purifoy** manages a team to assist and support Billing and Collections for all of our skilled nursing centers, and **Kathy McLawhorn**, RN, LNHA leads Risk Management. They, along with an experienced and

dedicated support team, provide the leadership, direction, technical expertise, and organizational skills that will ensure all new facilities are successful, high quality care facilities.

Cross Creek Health Care Background:

Cross Creek Health Care Center provides a complete continuum of care including short term rehabilitation, long term care, hospice care and out-patient therapy. The facility is located in rural Hyde County in a comfortable country environment. Their professional and compassionate staff offers planned care that is patient focused. Patients access our state of the art rehabilitation services including physical, occupational and speech therapy. With a reputation for providing outstanding rehabilitation services, Cross Creek offers patients with the ability to move from service to service as their needs change.

Enhanced therapy services at Cross Creek includes diathermy, that assists with decreasing pain, e-stimulation to support improved joint movement and muscle strength and vital stimulation that promotes better swallowing. When a patient is engaged in these enhanced services, they have a more positive experience during their regular therapy sessions.

Additionally, affiliates of the Applicants recently filed 2 CON's with this petition in mind. Part of the 2 CON's is to move 30 total SNF beds from Cross Creek to Mecklenburg County. These 30 beds are being moved partly because there was a large deficit in Mecklenburg, but also because the Applicants would be petitioning to add 23 ACH beds to Hyde County. This move of 30 beds will not only create more SNF private rooms, but will also allow Cross Creek to offer ACH rooms if approved of the petition and 2019 CON.

Reasons for the Proposed Adjustment:

Liberty recognizes the long-standing support of the Long-Term and Behavioral Health Committee and the State Health Coordinating Council with respect to petitions for adjusted need determinations. After careful assessment, Liberty has determined that there are unique circumstances in Hyde County that necessitate the addition for 23 adult care home beds in Hyde County. Approval of this petition will provide Liberty the opportunity to submit a Certificate of Need (CON) application during 2019 to add these 23 beds to their SNF facility in Hyde County.

Liberty justifies the proposed adjusted need determination based on several factors, including:

- There currently are no licensed adult care home beds actually located in Hyde County
- Extensive drive time from Hyde County to contiguous current adult care home facilities
- Liberty's existing skilled nursing facility, which is the only licensed skilled nursing provider in Hyde County
- Hyde County's population of persons age 65 and older are projected to increase at an astounding 66% between the 2010 US Census and 2030 projected census
- Basic Assumptions from SMFP shows need for Hyde County
- Hyde County Department of Social Services Support
- Community support for ACH care in Hyde County is extremely strong

Existing Adult Care Home Providers for Hyde County

In 2012, Meridian Senior Living, LLC petitioned and was granted an adjustment to Hyde and Tyrrell County which would combine the two counties into a single service area regarding the Adult Care Home Bed Need Determinations for the 2013 SMFP. The petition combined a 20 bed Need for Tyrrell County and 30 bed need for Hyde County to a combined single 50-bed need to be located within the service area of Hyde or Tyrrell County. Meridian Senior Living was granted the CON in 2013, and opened up Tyrrell House in Tyrrell County in October of 2016. The facility is located at 950 US-64, Columbia, NC.

According to the 2018 License Renewal Application submitted by Tyrrell House, they are licensed for 50 AL beds, 24 of which are licensed for dementia/Alzheimer in a Special Care Unit (SCU). Of the 50 beds available, 42 were filled. However, of the 24 SCU beds, only 16 were filled. Therefore, all the non-Alzheimer beds are filled, and the only available beds are located in the SCU unit. The occupancy is as follows:

As the data above displays, all assisted living beds are full, with only 8 Alzheimer/dementia beds available. This means any potential resident who does not have Alzheimer's disease or related dementia will have to go outside of the Hyde/Tyrrell county line's to find assisted living availability.

Geographical Access to Hyde County Residents

Hyde County, bordered on the south by the Pamlico Sound and the east by the Atlantic Ocean, is defined by water. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, the county has a total area of 1,424 square miles, of which 613 square miles is land and 811 square miles (57%) is water. It is the second-largest county in North Carolina by total area. However, with this large amount of water comes travel easily and quickly throughout the county.

One of the biggest proponents of this petition is the access (or lack thereof) of Hyde County residents into assisted living. Specifically speaking, the Applicants would like to point to number 3 of the proposed basic assumptions of the method for the 2019 SMFP. It states:

3. A goal of the planning process is a reasonable level of parity among citizens in their geographic access to adult care home facilities.

As stated above, there is currently not an assisted living facility located in Hyde County. Therefore, Hyde County residents in need of assisted living care must utilize out-of-county facilities. The Applicant used Google Earth to find approximate mileage and driving time from Tyrrell House to the most populous townships among adults aged 65 and over. These townships were: Lake Landing Township, Fairfield Township, and the County Seat Swan Quarter¹. Lake Landing Township is far and away the most populated township overall as well as the most populous among adults aged 65 and over, and it is located over 40 miles and 54 minutes away. Fairfield Township is the closest township in location to Tyrrell House, and it is still almost 30 miles and a 32 minute (one way) drive for a resident or family member to drive. Please refer to Table 2 and Table 3 below.

To compare, the Applicant also utilized Google Earth to find approximate mileage and driving time from Liberty’s current skilled nursing facility, Cross Creek Health Care, which would be the CON applicant should this petition be approved. See Table 4 and 5 below. As you can see from the tables, these drive times and total mileage for potential residents and family members would be significantly less if there were 23 additional beds located in Hyde County.

Combining this service area has not helped the residents of Hyde County. Please see **Attachment 1**. As you can see from the map, Tyrrell House is located near the top of Tyrell County, closer to Washington County than it is to Hyde County. In fact, some Hyde County residents are the same or even closer to facilities located in Beaufort County than they are to Tyrrell House. See below tables. The applicant's again utilized Google Earth to find approximate mileage and driving time from Beaufort County facilities (Autumnfield of Belhaven and Pantego Rest Home) to Hyde County townships among adults aged 65 and over. As you can see from the tables, Lake Landing Township and Fairfield Township have comparable mileage and drive times to these facilities as they do to Tyrrell House. Furthermore, Swan Quarter and Currituck Townships offer significantly less mileage and drive times to Beaufort facilities compared to Tyrrell House.

Geographical access to adult care home facilities is extremely important. Many factors can come into play for a resident or family member that must travel long distances to receive treatment and care. Some of these factors include: weather, traffic, accidents, and expenses. For the families of these residents, stress is already high when dealing with an ill family member, and worrying about the agonizing drive mileage and time should not be a concern of the family.

To conclude, adding 23 adult care home beds in Hyde County would greatly improve the geographic access of ACH services for local Hyde County citizens.

Demographics among the Senior Population

Although Hyde County is the second-largest county in North Carolina by total area, it is also the second-least populous county in North Carolina. However, a particularly noteworthy aspect of the Hyde County population is its age. Liberty has analyzed the local demographics and feels that the Hyde County market is strong enough to support this project. An analysis of the Hyde County population reveals a strong residents and projected growth for those aged 65+.

According to Spotlight pop-facts data ran by the Applicant, the 2017 estimated total population in Hyde County is projected to be 5,503. Even so, the overall population between 2010-2017 has gone down 5.28% and is projected to drop another 1.13% between 2017-2022.

However, of the 5,503 projected population in 2017, 1,038 (or 18.86%) are projected to be 65 and over. To compare, there were only 875 people aged 65 and over in 2010. That means there was a growth of 163 people aged 65+, or almost 19%. The growing is expected to continue, as well, as an additional 111 people aged 65+ is expected to populate this area in 2022. That is another growth of almost 12%. See **Attachment 2** regarding these figures.

Moreover, according to figures from the NC Office of State Budget and Management, the population of persons age 65 and older in Hyde County is projected to grow from 875 at the time of the 2010 US Census to 1,410 by 2030, an increase of 66%. More specifically, between 2010 and 2030 the Hyde County population age 65-74 is projected to grow by 50%, the population age 75-84 by 100% and the population over age 85 by 46%. See Table 6 below, which displays this data. Also see **Attachment 3**, which exhibits July 1, 2010 and July 1, 2030 County Total Age Groups.

The increasing elderly population in Hyde County is essential to note. In 2010, according to the Overview, published by The National Center for Assisted Living, approximately 89% of assisted living residents were 65 years of age or older². Thus, this population represents the most significant demographic in need of the proposed assisted living beds.

Basic Assumptions from SMFP shows need for Hyde County

The applicants understand and recognize the long-standing support of the Long-Term and Behavioral Health Committee and the State Health Coordinating Council with respect to petitions for adjusted need determinations. The Applicants understand that, in 2012, approval of the Meridian Senior Living petition was needed to combine Hyde and Tyrrell in order for a functionally feasible and economically rational facility to be built. At the time, there were 30 beds allocated to Hyde County and 20 beds allocated to Tyrrell. Combining them into a financially feasible single service with a 50 bed need determination allowed an operator adequate profit margins which was a reasonable purpose at the time. However, the Applicants are now realizing that the residents of Hyde County are still missing out on close proximity assisted living care. Therefore, the Applicants used population data taken from Spotlight pop-facts data and the methodology used in the 2018 SMFP to display the 2019 proposed SMFP Table 11B: Adult Care Home Need Projections for 2022 of just Hyde County. See Table 9 below. As you can see, Hyde County has a deficit of 23 beds.

The Applicants recognize the adult care home bed need methodology has been revised effective in the proposed 2019 State Medical Facilities Plan. The new methodology uses one use rate (no age groups), vacancy factor of 95% applied to projected bed utilization, and then must meet a deficit index and occupancy percentage for a need to be established. Therefore, the Applicants used population data taken from Spotlight pop-facts data and the methodology used in the 2019 projected SMFP to display the 2019 proposed SMFP Table 11C: Adult Care Home Need Projections for 2022 of just Hyde County. See Table 10 below. The Applicants used the bed rate listed for Hyde/Tyrrell and calculated projected bed utilization for just Hyde County. As stated in the methodology, if any service area's deficit is 50 percent or more of its total projected bed need, the need determination is the amount of the deficit rounded to the nearest 10. Therefore, per the new methodology, Hyde County has a deficit of 32 beds and a need of 30 beds.

The Applicants decided to use the projected need found by using the 2018 SMFP methodology because of the unique circumstances of Hyde County. As stated previously, a noteworthy aspect of the Hyde County population is its age. 21% of the projected 2022 population is estimated to be over 65 years of age. Therefore, with a total population of only 5,441, the applicants feel projecting Hyde Counties bed need was better served using age-specific use rates.

Hyde County Department of Social Services Support

The Applicants have spoken with Hyde County Department of Social Services (DSS) and they have stated that, while it is always a case by case situation, they refer many residents to the Beaufort county facilities. Please see support letter in **Attachment 4** from Shelley Hodges of the Hyde County DSS. As Ms. Hodges states, “Hyde County is in desperate need of an assisted living facility in our area. At our agency we have to refer adults to other counties for assisted living needs.”

Community Support

Community support for assisted living in Hyde County is extremely strong. Cross Creek has received letters of support from: Bill Rich, Hyde County Manager, Kris Noble, Assistant County Manager and Director of Economic Development and Planning, Earl Pugh, Jr., Chair of the Board of Commissioners, and Dr. Steve Skahill, Medical Director in Hyde County. These people, in conjunction with their agencies, know of the great need for local access to assisted living services for residents of Hyde County. Please see **Attachment 4** regarding letters of support we have received.

In addition, Liberty has also received abundant support from other local leaders and organizations, all expressing their strong support for the proposed project in Hyde County. These organizations and individuals understand the great local demand for assisted living services, and recognize the need for improved access to these services in Hyde County.

Adverse Effects if No Adjustment to the Need Determination

If this petition is not approved, the need for assisted living in Hyde County will remain unmet. Residents will have to continue to rely on out of county facilities, most over 45 miles away. Additionally, the population of persons age 65 and older is projected to increase at an astounding 66% between 2010 and 2030. This is important to note because, as stated before, approximately 89% of assisted living residents were 65 years of age or older.

Given the projected population growth in Hyde County among older adults and the lack of adult care home beds located in Hyde County, it would be practical to approve an adjusted need determination for 23 adult care home beds in Hyde County in the 2019 SMFP.

Alternatives to the Proposed Adjustment

The following alternatives were considered:

1. Maintain the Status Quo. Maintaining the status quo puts Hyde County at risk of not receiving assisted living services. This alternative was quickly dismissed.
2. Petition for an adjusted need determination. The project presented in this application is the most appropriate solution to the need for assisted living services in the service area. If this petition was approved, Cross Creek is prepared to pursue a CON in 2019 to

provide high quality, accessible assisted living services to the growing elderly patient population in Hyde County. Please see the reasons for the proposed adjustment above.

Evidence of Non-duplication Services

The approval of this petition would not result in unnecessary duplication of assisted living services in Hyde County for the following reasons:

- There is currently not an ACH facility located in Hyde County
- Tyrrell House is located at the top of Tyrrell County, almost an hour away from all major Hyde County Townships
- Hyde Counties senior population is expected to exponentially grow, therefore causing a need for additional assisted living

Safety and Quality, Access and Value

The requested adjustment is consistent with the three Basic Principles governing the development of the North Carolina State Medical Facilities Plan: Safety and Quality, Access and Value.

Safety and Quality

Liberty is a family-owned and operated company, with a strong commitment to Caring with Excellence. Since 1870, the McNeill Family has developed and operated health care services in North Carolina.

Approval of this petition would allow Liberty to apply for CON approval of adult care home services in Hyde County. The safety and quality policies and procedures currently followed by Liberty would continue for those served in Hyde County. Liberty places a strong focus on the performance improvement and patient safety and makes every effort to ensure safe, positive patient outcomes and process standardization across the organization.

Access

As stated before, there is currently not an ACH facility located in Hyde County. Approval of this petition would allow Hyde County residents assisted living services within their inhabited county. They would not have to rely on out-of-county facilities. Furthermore, Cross Creek has and will continue to serve any person without regard to age, sex, race, color, religion, or national origin.

Value

Liberty's current skilled nursing facility in Hyde County would be the CON applicant should this petition be approved. Therefore, this will create the most cost effective solution for developing the proposed additional ACH beds, as this SNF facility is already established and asserted within the community. Furthermore, Cross Creek balances high quality care with cost savings initiatives as evidenced by the company's ability to continue to provide quality care while maneuvering through today's challenging healthcare world. The experience of the owners and the

management team, as well as the strong support for its employees, indicate that Cross is well qualified to provide ACH services to Hyde County residents.

Liberty works continually to optimize value and outcomes through the quality, efficiency, and effectiveness of everything we do. Our foremost obligation is to achieve the goals of our customers by devising and delivering high quality health care to each individual served.

Conclusion

To conclude, Liberty Commons Nursing and Rehab Center of Hyde County, LLC, d/b/a Cross Creek Health Care (“Cross Creek”) seeks to expand adult care home services in Hyde County and petitions for an adjusted need determination for 23 adult care home beds in Hyde County in the 2019 SMFP. This petition has identified various circumstances in Hyde County that necessitate the development of these 23 ACH beds. Liberty respectfully requests the Long-Term and Behavioral Health Committee and the State Health Coordinating Council include a need determination for an additional 23 ACH beds in Hyde County in the 2019 SMFP.

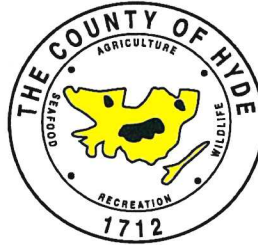

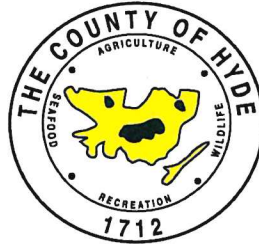
