23		surgery service area of an academic medical center teaching hospital designated in the State	
24		Medical Facilities Plan shall not be limited to 90 road miles.	
25	<del>(5)</del> <u>(6)</u>	"Open heart surgery services" shall have has the same meaning as defined in G.S. 131E-176(18b).	
26	<del>(6)</del> <u>(7)</u>	"Open heart surgical procedures" means specialized surgical procedures which: that:	
27		(a) utilize a heart-lung bypass machine (the "pump"); <u>and</u>	
28		(b) are designed to correct congenital or acquired cardiac and coronary disease and; by	
29		opening the chest for surgery on the heart muscle, valves, arteries, or other parts of the	
30		heart.	
31		(c) are identified by Medicare Diagnostic Related Group ("DRG") numbers 104, 105, 106,

33	(7)	"Primary open heart surgery service area" means a geographical area defined by the applicant,	
34		which has boundaries that are not farther than 45 road miles from the facility, except that the	
35		primary open heart surgery service area of an academic medical center teaching hospital	
36		designated in the State Medical Facilities Plan shall not be limited to 45 road miles.
