Re: UNC Health's Comments on Radiation Protection Rules 10A NCAC 15 .0601 - .0608, .0610-.0611

The proposed rule change, specifically Section .0604(2)(A) stating that fluoroscopy can only be performed by an advanced practitioner provider under the personal supervision of a physician would be a major change to the standard operating procedures at all of our hospitals, including our academic medical center and community hospitals, and would have significant negative effects on the care we can provide.

In current state, our experienced advanced practitioner providers (APPs) perform an array of basic procedures within Interventional Radiology independently, but with indirect supervision of faculty physicians (meaning physicians are immediately available for assistance as needed but not physically present within the room). These APPs are crucial for patient throughput and efficiency and are key for patient access in providing care in multiple locations. This also allows physicians to perform complex and higher-level procedures.

The proposed rule change would have the following impacts:

1. Delays in care for inpatients and outpatients
2. Increased length of stay for hospital inpatients
3. Decreased outpatient procedural availability, especially at our non-hospital center
4. Increased cost of operations requiring more attending physicians for adequate coverage of procedural rooms
